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The Department of English consists of 19 Staff Members of whom 3 are PhD's and 1 is SET and 1 is NET qualified.

The commencement of the odd semester started with good hope and confidence. By the start of June, "Bridge courses" were conducted by the faculty members of English department for the I UG students of all branches implying on the basic tenets of English language and its daily usage.

The inaugural of the academic association meet was conducted on 17th of September and the Spokesperson was Mrs. Dr.N.Gajeshwari, Associate Professor, BDU constituent college, Orathanadu. She delivered an effective and captivating lecture on the topic "Glimpses on Asian Literature" and she discussed different kinds of genres based on Asian Literature.
